Environmental studies are compulsory to study as part of the regular curriculum. The flexible and innovative curricula include credit-based courses and projects in the areas of community engagement, service, and environmental education. The University of Kalyani intends to impose the new education policy 2020, including a new syllabus and introducing multi-disciplinary courses for each subject, in the upcoming academic year. 2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The progress of students in their learning is assessed by the respective subject teachers through various methods such as classroom lectures, oral and written class tests, assignments, project works, tutorials, and remedial classes. For slow learners, small groups are formed, and remedial and tutorial classes are provided to give them support in the areas where they are seen to be lacking. Additional tests are conducted outside the curriculum to assess the learning ability of students, which can help in building a culture of teamwork and developing leadership as well as interpersonal skills.

Advanced learners are also identified and taken care of by the teachers of respective departments, to help them excel more and optimize their potential in academic as well as co-curricular activities. They are encouraged to participate in different inter-college competitions and even at the state or national level. The faculty helps and encourages interested students to write and publish academic papers in various platforms, and suggests advanced readings in relevant topics to enhance their understanding of the subject, which can enable them to pursue research in the future.

Our college, as a constituent college of the University of Kalyani, has a well-structured internal evaluation system, which follows the University's guidelines. The primary aim of the Internal Assessment is to ensure that the students are aware of the Internal Assessment Evaluation Criteria and to enhance transparency and rigor, thereby focusing on individual and original work.

Our teachers regularly arrange remedial and tutorial classes to provide additional help to students, and re-tests are provided to students who need them. The marks are carefully uploaded and cross-checked before being sent to the University to avoid any discrepancy. Our college's internal evaluation system is transparent and efficient, with adequate checks and balances. Students who feel aggrieved have the option of taking up the matter with the Heads of their respective departments. Additionally, the College has a Grievance Redressal Cell, which looks after any complaints related to the internal examination. Photocopying facilities and a range of other services, including lending and reading room services, internet browsing, online public access catalog service, and career information service, are available for the benefit of our students.

Our administrative wing, consisting of the Principal's Office, the Accounts Office, the General Office, and the Head-Clerk's office, is fully Wi-Fi enabled and equipped with modern technologies, making it easy for our staff to carry out their duties efficiently and effectively. At Srikrishna College, we prioritize the well-being of our students and staff, which is why we offer access to RO water filters and coolers. We are committed to providing an environment that is conducive to learning and growth, and we are confident that our infrastructure and facilities will meet the expectations of our students.

4.2 - Library as a Learning Resource

Our college library boasts an extensive book collection with 23576 books available at the moment. In the current academic year 2022-23, we have added 954 new books to our collection. We offer a range of services that include daily home issue facilities, access to e-journals and e-books through Inflibnet Nlist membership, and syllabus for all subjects, including both current and old ones. Additionally, we provide a question paper service, online public access catalogue service, internet browsing facilities, newspaper service, career information service, and CD lending service.

As part of our continuous efforts to improve the library experience for our students, we have recently installed 10 new desktops in the reading room, specifically for online reading and educational purposes.

In 2021, we installed KOHA 20.05.200.000, an Integrated Library Management System (ILMS), to make the library fully automated. This automated package of library services has several functions, including speedy book circulation, different types of search engines, book tags, ID card and barcode generation support, flexibility in circulation policy defining, different policies for different member types and different material types, special policy allotment to special members, and annual stock verification. All books are barcoded to reduce the transaction time for book issue and return.

4.3 - IT Infrastructure

The college has been constantly making efforts to update its IT facilities including Wi-Fi. The college has a total of 118computers out of which 90are available for students. Computer Lab has 37 desktops. All the computers are with the latest configuration. In addition, there are 30 printers and 16LCD projectors.All the computers are supported by LAN and a high user capacity Wi-fi system.

The College has a Computer and Network maintenance Committee to look after the maintenance and support of the ICT infrastructure. In general, computing and internet facilities are available to all teachers and students as the whole campus is on Wi-Fi connectivity. The computer hardware and software labs and other departmental labs are upgraded with the latest software and hardware along with printing and scanning facilities. The latest black and white and colour printers are installed in different sections of the college for quick printing of various documents.

SSS and Feedback from different stakeholders were taken via a Google form. The Srikrishna College library has been automated. Since 2021 KOHA 20.05.200.000 has been installed to make the library fully automated.

The total admission process is online from 2016-17. The institute has installed Complete Accounts Management Software, online admission software and student management software. Now the college is also upgraded with online UPS and generator backup facilities. Most of the administrative workis done online like question papers, marks entry, declaration of results, registration etc.

4.4.2 - There are established systems and procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc.

The college ensures regular maintenance and upkeep of all infrastructural facilities. Maintenance tasks are outsourced to take care of the extra workload. The Maintenance and Beautification Committee supervises the maintenance and beautification procedures. Members of the committee have chalked out a systematic plan for the repair and maintenance of physical and academic facilities.

The Purchase Committee, consisting of the Principal as Chairman, Bursar and committee members, purchases furniture, equipment and other necessary goods as per the requirements. Regular meetings are held to approve the necessary purchases for maintaining college infrastructure.

The classrooms are well-ventilated, well-functioning and wellmaintained with adequate benches, black and green boards, lights and fans. Two full-time support staff along with casual workers look after the cleanliness of classrooms, college campus, and toilets.

The Library Committee meets regularly to discuss improvements and updates to the facilities provided by the library. The college garden is maintained by the NSS unit of our college and casual workers.

Casual workers are responsible for maintenance work such as electric work, plumbing, and furniture repairing. Technical staff from local areas are contacted as and when necessary for maintenance of computer, internet facilities, and LCD monitors, and the Computer and Network Maintenance Committee oversees the maintenance procedures for these issues.

Efficient technicians are called from outside for the maintenance of air-conditioners, generators, and fire extinguishers. The Department of Physical Education looks after the maintenance of the sports infrastructure.

The canteen is outsourced and is open for both students and teachers.
