3. Objective of the Audit:

To fulfil the wish to create a prosperous environment for the institution a strict and continuous internal Audit of Academic and Administrative process is adopted by the committee members and the assessment of the audit will be placed to Principal of the College and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) to take the steps toward the improvement of the college. The main objectives of this audit are:

- To identify the bottlenecks in the existing mechanisms of the system.
- To suggest the methods for improvement and for overcoming the weaknesses.
- To identify the opportunities for academic reforms through the optimum utilization of resources.
- To suggest the methods for improvement of quality keeping in mind criteria and reports by NAAC and other bodies.

4. Methodology of the Audit:

According to the prescribed specific methodology or guidelines given by NAAC to conduct the Audit of Academic and Administrative process, the committee has prepared an own guidelines and methodology for the audit. A scientific and systematic method for reviewing

- Number of student progression to higher education is increased. The department should motivate more students to pursue higher education.
- The faculty members should involve in research works.
- Student teacher ratio should increase.

- The department has signed a MoU for research collaboration with Department of Physics, Santal Bidroha Sardha Satabarsiki Mahavidyalaya, Goaltore, Paschim Medinipure.
- Research publications is good. And two faculty members are carrying out research projects.

6.13 Physical Education:

- Research publication by the faculty members is average. The faculty members should involve in research works.
- The department should initiate to start collaborative programmes such as faculty exchange, Student exchange etc.
- The department should take initiative to arrange some skill enhancement programmes, educational visits for the students.

6.15 Sanskrit:

- The student’s admission is not up to the mark. The initiative must be taken by the departments to increase the student admission.
- The student progression to higher education is very good.

- The department arranged a certificate course on spoken Sanskrit. The participation in this course is very good.
- The department also arranged few skills development programmes for the students.
- The department has signed one MoU with Central Sanskrit University and some collaborative work has been performed under this MoU.
- Research publication is average. The faculty members should involve in research works.
- The department should initiate to start collaborative programmes such as faculty exchange. Student exchange etc.
- The department should take initiative to arrange some skill enhancement programmes, educational visits for the students.

6.16 Sociology:

- The student enrolment number is not good. Teachers should take initiative to increase student strength.
- New full-time faculty post should be created.
- The department has organized a special lecture in this academic year.
- Research publication is good.
- The teacher should motivate the students to pursue higher education.
- The department should take initiative to arrange some centric programmes, educational visits for the students.










- After NEP implementation in this academic year, the rate of student admission is decreased for most of the departments except Bengali, History and Political Science. The college should take initiative to improve student admission.
- Most of the departments took steps to organize some student centric programmes to encourage them to come to the college on regular basis. A good number of seminars and student extension activities are arranged by many departments.
- The students are under regular internal assessment. And progress of the students is discussed with the parents.
- The teaching according to academic schedule is good. Lesson plans according to curriculum, academic calendar, and class routine are maintained by all the departments.
- The college has signed eleven new state level MoUs with different degree colleges in this academic year. The college has also three state level, two national level ongoing MoUs.
- The involvement of the teachers in research work is not up to the mark and more teacher should involve in research work and apply for several research grants.
- The college took initiative to provide TA to faculty members for presenting their research work in seminar/workshop etc.
- NSS Unit has organized various health check-ups and awareness programmes. The unit also arranged programmes related to the Green and Clean Campus Initiative.

- The college also organized some programmes related to Gender Sensitization, Self-Defence, Yoga etc. And also, an art and craft course for women students has been organized by the college.
- The college collected feedbacks from the stakeholders.
- Various commemorative days were celebrated at the college.
- The placement cell has organized several programmes to guide the students for their future career path after graduation. And few students have been selected in off-campus placement at several MNC.
- In this academic year, Srikrishna College Employee's Co-operative Credit Society Limited (SKCCCS LTD.) has been registered for staff welfare.
- The college has organized different health and social awareness campaign as part of the village adoption programme at Madna Village. The college has started the planning to adopt new villages under "Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA)", a flagship program of Ministry of Education, GoI.
- The college should take initiative to arrange some certificate course like spoken English, Computer training, etc for students. And also take initiative to start professional development /administrative training Programmes for teaching and non-teaching staff.




